Training changes



A guide to the training changes in 2012. Based on TSC 06/11.

Why the change?

The primary reason for the changes is to equip our membership with additional skills and ensure that our first aiders are appropriately trained to deal with a wider range of situations and help be the difference. Within the West Midlands we are now using a modular structure.

How does this affect me?

All existing first aiders and advanced first aiders will be required to up-skill by completing a number of modules within 2012 prior to their annual role assessment. Please see the following guides to up-skilling based on your current role to see which modules you will need to complete.

Frequently asked questions

I completed my training at the end of 2011 and now it sounds like I have to do lots more straight away, is this right?

All existing members are required to up-skill. As such this affects those brand new to those whom have been in the organisation many years. Please bear with us whilst we make this change.

I am new to LINKS, what do I do?

Anyone brand new to LINKS will need to complete modules 1 to 15. Your committee will help you through this process.

I didn't finish my training in 2011, do I have to re-do it?

No. You will need to complete only the modules which you haven't completely covered before. For example if you have completed a moving and handling course, you will not need to complete module 2.

Some modules sound like ones I have already completed.

You will be exempt from any module for which you have already completed all elements. Please refer to the individual sheets which follow to see exactly which modules you need to complete. Some modules may sound similar but actually contain more content however.

I completed my training last year but didn't do a role assessment.

You will need to complete the modules required to up-skill prior to taking a role assessment. Please refer to the 'first aider' sheet which follows.

I didn't get assessed for role in 2011, what do I do?

All operational member are required to be assessed for role to provide event cover each year and this has been in place for many years. If you have any in date qualifications, these can be accredited against the modules. Please refer to the relevant sheet which follows. If they are out of date, you will need to complete all the modules.

Module 1 includes induction and paperwork, do I have to do those again? No. You will be required to complete the safeguarding element of the module, but not the paperwork and CRB, though remember your CRB does need to be renewed every three years.

Please note that by the end of 2012, members will need to be First aiders or Advanced first aiders under the new system and it will not be possible to hold other qualifications outside of the role. For example a First aider will not be able to hold Medical gases or Moving and handling for first aiders unless they qualify as an Advanced first aider.

Whilst a previous Advanced first aider may change to a new First aider their skills will still exceed those of their old role.

Other qualifications

Please note that by the end of 2012, members will need to be First aiders or Advanced first aiders under the new system and it will not be possible to hold other qualifications outside of the role. Members will not be able to hold other qualifications such as Medical gases unless they become Advanced first aiders under the new system.
